Now efforts are underway to raise the estimated \$500,000 needed to sandblast, repaint and repair damage to the hull. The museum is working with veterans organizations to help raise the money needed. Donations from anyone, in any amount, are appreciated and welcome, and the museum is offering thank-you gifts. \$50 - color poster of the USS Silversides. \$100 - a 48-page booklet describing the Silversides' wartime patrols. \$500 - poster and booklet. \$1,000 poster, booklet, a piece of the boat's original teak deck and a name plague to be placed in the museum. More than 35,000 people visit the Silversides every year, and another 12,000 Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and church group members spend overnight stays on the Silversides. The badge is still in the proposal stage, undergoing more investigation before it will be formally presented to National for consideration as a nationally available, official merit badge.
