Planning Commission Votes to Deny Rezoning

Last month, the Blue Lake Township Planning Commission voted 5-0 to recommend a denial of the Chicago Area Council's rezoning request for the Owasippe Scout Reservation. The meeting, chaired by Lyle Monette, also included in the motion a list of reasons for the recommendation of the commission. Reasons identified by members of the commission included the increased need for public safety equipment, loss of the natural character of the township, and potentially doubling of the population of the township in a single act. The 175 written comments collected since January as well as the petitions were made available at the meeting.

The council submitted the proposal to change the current zoning from Forest Recreational – Institutional, which allows for year-round camping, recreation and educational activities, to various density residential parcels. After holding a public hearing in January at which numerous people spoke out against the rezoning proposal and more than 2,600 petitions were delivered, the commission took just six minutes to reach the unanimous decision.

Their recommendation is now passed along to the Muskegon County Planning Commission for its review before it is passed ultimately to the Blue Lake Township Board for a final vote.

It is no secret that we are very happy with this initial decision. The rezoning by the council would be the next step to actually selling the property. This denial by the commission is a step toward blocking the rezoning completely. We hope the Blue Lake Township Board will reinforce this recommendation by the planning commission. There is no scheduled date of the board meeting at which this issue will be discussed or decided. Scouter 11 Get Their Wish

It was no genie that granted the wish of 11 Scouters who brought suit against the Chicago Area Council for irregularities in governance. It was Judge Martin S. Agran of the Chancery Court of Cook County. He ruled on March 1 that the proposed slate from May of 2005 would finally be brought to a vote of the council voting membership. On that date and in subsequent hearings in early March, Judge Agran set the date of the election as April 20. This is the chance for all registered Chartered Organization Representatives (CORs) to officially vote on the slate that has been denied to them for almost a full year.

The meeting and vote will be held at the Holiday Inn Mart Plaza on April 20 at 6:30 p.m. All CORs are encouraged to attend this meeting and vote on behalf of their Troop/Crew/Pack. This is an important vote as the slate had been blocked by the Executive Board of the CAC and was petitioned for by more than 40% of the voting representatives last year.

This has been a hotly contested topic ultimately resulting in a lawsuit brought by 11 individuals against the council for irregular governance, breach of council bylaws, and breach of the Illinois Not-For-Profit Corporation Act. Judge Agran has heard many arguments and motions since September from both sides, and he ordered the vote on this slate back in January. Council has delayed the vote until this final hearing when Judge Agran set the date and location as well as requirements that notice of the election be sent by March 6. The council reportedly is filing an appeal in this matter to a higher court.

Time for Tweeter – Sign Up Now

Last summer the OSA raised over \$5,500 volunteering at the Tweeter Center selling concessions. We had 25 volunteers working concession stands at seven different concerts, including Warped Tour, OzzFest, and Motley Crue. Although the Tweeter Center has a new name - it is now called the First Midwest Bank Amphitheater - we still have the same fundraising opportunities.

As we did last year, we are committing to work mostly Saturday afternoon and evening concerts. So far, Nine Inch Nails, Sammy Hagar, and Jimmy Buffet are scheduled for Saturdays in July and August. This summer, OzzFest XI and Vans Warped Tour 2006 are scheduled for Sundays in July. Since working at these two festivals or all-day concerts raised nearly \$2,500 last summer, we plan on adding two Sunday concerts to our schedule.

This summer we are trying to raise over \$6,000. In order to meet this goal, we will need to bring more volunteers to work concessions at each concert. Volunteers will need to arrive about an hour early to set up the concession stand and get everything ready for the concert. Some concerts last only four to five hours, and the festivals run all day long. Check your calendars now and let one of our co-leaders know what Saturdays or July Sundays you are available. As more concerts are set, we'll update owasippe.com so you can see what bands are coming to town on which dates. Anyone 18 years old or older is welcome to volunteer. If you have taken a TIPS training course in the past two years, your training is still good so you don't need to take the course again.

This summer Tricia Monahan, Phil Groben, and Scott Dorencz will be co-leading this fundraiser. 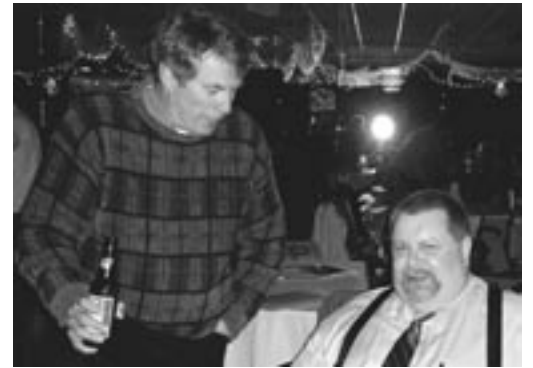

95 Years Young!

Can you believe this will be the 95th summer of camp at Owasippe? That's an amazing milestone for any organization, and the OSA is happy to do our part to mark the event. There are two special items on this newsletter alone that we want to point out so you don't miss them.

First is the anniversary sticker on the outside of the newsletter next to your address label. This foil sticker was donated by Jerry Lutz's sister, who runs a printing company and very nicely offered to print these for our use on newsletters and mailings. It's an attractive sticker, and we thank her and Jerry for getting them for us to use.

Also on the outside of your newsletter is a custom stamp, printed only for use on this issue. We printed only 500 of these stamps and used a vast majority of those mailing out this issue. Possible Cabela's in Whitehall

It's possible that a major chain store could find its way to a new home in Whitehall. Cabela's outdoor and sporting goods store has been looking for a new store location in the Western Michigan area. Fruitport Township is just one of the areas courting the store, but Muskegon County is doing its part to bring the chain to Whitehall. The county government is prepared to offer Cabela's the former wastewater treatment property that has been the subject of recent environmental cleanup. The price tag could be as low as \$1 for the one-square-mile parcel.

Cabela's was originally looking at the city of Walker in Kent County for its location, but both Fruitport and Whitehall have now offered their land for the project. Both towns offer large parcels of land and easy access off US-31. The Whitehall land also includes a 50-acre lined lake that could potentially be used for boat and watercraft demonstration and trial on site. There is no word from the store headquarters as to which or how seriously the locations are being considered as a future location.

BIGGER John's Pizza?

The city of Whitehall is working with Big John's Pizza restaurant to possibly help owner Jack Miller expand and improve the restaurant and location. The restaurant is located at the curve on Colby Road in Whitehall. Miller hopes to add a deck to the back of the restaurant as well as a restroom, new furnace, office, fencing and a parking lot.

The city may sell the needed land to him for \$1 as part of a program that makes improvements using property taxes collected in the same district. The funding would need to be approved by a board made up of city officials, business owners, and citizens.

The break on the land would greatly reduce the cost of the project, and is an incentive to keep local businesses in the downtown area.

Summer Plans Being Set

Part of the lineup for this year's Summer Celebration in Muskegon was announced in February and includes Smash Mouth, The Steve Miller Band, country band Sugarland, and singer and TV personality Raven Symone.

The Muskegon Air Fair is also solidifying its lineup including the U.S. Army's Golden Knights parachute team, Derric Lee's Red Tail Aerobatics, and a reenactment of an airborne assault called "Sky Soldiers – A Tribute to Patriots." The last item blends soldiers, helicopters and pyrotechnics into a single show.

Summer Celebration runs June 29 through July 9. Eight more headliners remain to be announced. The festival centers at Heritage Landing on the shore of Muskegon Lake and annually draws an estimated 600,000 people.
