## CAC Appeal Denied, Exploring Options with TNC

On March 18, the Michigan Court of Appeals denied the appeal brought by the Chicago Area Council against Blue Lake Township in relation to the rezoning of the Owasippe property to forest recreation – institution. The appeal hearing was held in January in Grand Rapids, and both sides were limited to just 30 minutes each to present their case.

The decision of the appellate court upholds Judge Marietti's decision in 2008 that the rezoning of the property did not represent a taking of the land. The more constrictive zoning prohibits residential development, and the CAC had sought to remove the FR-I designation so it could move forward with a \$19 million sale contract with an investment development group.


In the written report from the Michigan Court of Appeals the court stated that, "Contrary to the Boy Scouts' contentions, the Township is not requiring that the Boy Scouts keep their land substantially in a natural state. The zoning ordinance allows them to pursue campground development on the land, although not necessarily the type of residential development that the Boy Scouts would prefer to pursue."

In addition, the court said, "(legal standards) does not guarantee property owners a certain minimum economic profit from the use of their land ... It is well established that a municipality is not required to zone property for its most profitable use."

The Council has not indicated officially whether it will pursue a further appeal to the Michigan Supreme Court on the case.

Even before the appellate court announced its ruling, the CAC made public the intention to work with The Nature Conservancy to place about three-quarters of the property up for sale to conservation buyers. The Council announced it was seeking input from Scouters on specific wording of the Memorandum of Understanding with TNC. The property would be placed up for sale with the understanding that the buyer would immediately put the land under conservation easement, protecting it from all future development. A memorandum is a non-binding agreement that allows discussion to move deeper and set guidelines that establish each side's desires.

The CAC is requesting continued access and use of all properties sold, so the Council could continue running the current summer camp program while only retaining



ownership of about 1,000 acres that encompasses Wolverine, Ad Center, Crown/Carlen and the central portion of Blackhawk. A portion of Blackhawk plus Hiawatha Beach, Paradise Valley, Owasippe's grave, Diamond O Ranch, Staff Village, Reneker, and some backcountry property would all be divided into plats for sale to one or multiple buyers.

During the open meeting the Council held to hear Scouter input, both Council President Glen Emig and Scout Executive Chuck Dobbins said a major consideration for the success of the proposal involves Blue Lake Township restoring the zoning of the property to its previous classification. Rezoning of the property allows the Council to make more money on the sale, and TNC would receive more for brokering the deal at the higher price. CAC would need to petition Blue Lake Township for a change in the zoning back to the previous classification, the same result it is seeking in the lawsuit against Blue Lake Township.

The meeting was said to be open and frank. Many Scouters voiced the need for facilities like Family Camp and the corral, which the Council said would likely be relocated and still operated as part of the summer program. When asked what the plan would be if the township denied rezoning the property, Dobbins said it was likely the CAC would have to hold a large fundraising campaign and focus only on maintaining camps Blackhawk and Wolverine. ✦

## **US-31 Historical Designation in the Works**

Area tourism groups are joining forces with Michigan beach towns to push for historical designation for what was once the West Michigan Pike. The strip of highway that runs along the Lake Michigan shoreline has various names today - Red Arrow Highway, Michigan 63, Blue Star Highway, A-2 and U.S. 31. But, once upon a time, it had just one name, the West Michigan Pike. Tourism and convention groups in coastal towns are now working to have the route designated a state heritage route under the much older moniker.

The designation would provide grant funding for historical designation signs, road improvement and advertising to increase tourism.

## **Gerber Dining Hall Nears Completion**

Gerber Scout Camp, Owasippe's neighbor, is almost done with the construction of its new \$1.5 million dining hall to replace the old one destroyed in December 2008 by heavy snow fall. The new building, named Centennial Lodge in honor of BSA's 100th anniversary this year, will be able to hold 700 people. The old building could barely fit 500, and the expanded size will allow the camp to better handle the growing camp population this year.

Features include stone pillars and log beams, a covered front porch area, and emergency shelter capability. It is expected to be completed in time for the opening of the camp season in mid-June.


