



Owasippe to Celebrate its 100th Anniversary

Now that Scouting has celebrated its 100th anniversary, it is Owasippe's turn. Owasippe Scout Reservation, America's first Scout camp, will celebrate its 100th anniversary this year.

On July 22, 23 and 24 (Christmas in July weekend), the CAC will welcome Owasippe alumni, visitors and the public to the birthday party. The party will cap off a summer of anniversary events that will include a celebration each week. The big event, to be held at the Ad Center, will include a Scout Show, a stage show celebration, and a host of visitors to help in the commemoration.

The Scout Show will include show-and-do demos by units exhibiting traditional Scouting skills. The stage show is going to include a host of dignitaries all gathered to join in the fun.


Visitors and alumni are invited to join us for the event either as a day visitor on Saturday or as a camp visitor spending the weekend camping on the reservation. The fees are as follows:

Portions of Owasippe May Come Under County Conservancy

CAC Council President Glen Emig and Scout Executive Chuck Dobbins published the following memo in mid-February:

In keeping with our promise to keep you apprised of our ongoing efforts to find a conservancy solution for Owasippe, we want to share a public notice from Muskegon County.

The Muskegon County Conservation District (MCCD) has expressed an interest in purchasing into conservancy any of the Owasippe property our Council deems to be excess

property. In order for Muskegon County to even consider purchasing any of the Owasippe property, it has to be part of their state-approved recreation plan. This notice relates to the County beginning the process to update their state-approved recreation plan.

We have no imminent sale activity with the county. To our knowledge they have no funding currently identified for the purchase of any of our property. This is just an initial step in their future planning process. Just in case you need some background, the Council is committed to keeping the entire (continued on pg. 2)

County Conservancy (continued)

Owasippe property ecologically intact. We are, however, looking for a conservation solution that will allow us to sell property that is determined to be excess into a conservation easement that provides us money to put back into the core camps, prohibits any development on these parcels, and gives us the perpetual right to hike, leave no trace camp, etc. This is consistent with the Owasippe Task Force recommendations made to the Board of Directors on May 19, 2010.

Editor's Note: The MCCD held a public meeting on February 22nd to hear comments, but no further action has taken place. A change to the county recreation plan would allow the Muskegon Conservation District to be eligible for federal and state grants that would help fund a potential purchase. The county is also likely to contribute, but it's too early to determine how much, said MCD Executive Director Jeff Auch. ♣

CAC Gets Awarded Conservation Grant

A UPS Conservation Grant application that Wayne Hanson and I completed was awarded to CAC for \$10,000. Of the 90 Scout councils that applied, only 9 councils were awarded grants. The 2 major goals of the grant are to re-brand the adventure part of the Scouting program to begin with adventures in the local natural resource base of the CAC and to offer local natural resource program centers the opportunity to organize their own age-appropriate Scout unit.

Through the use of local natural resources inside or close to CAC, more youth and adults will participate in local adventure activities including those of the Chicago Park District, the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, Illinois Department of Natural Resources, National Park Service, and the U.S. Forest Service. It's a win-win for the land owning agencies as they increase their site user numbers, the BSA units will grow in membership, and there will also be an increase in the number of units in the under-served communities in CAC. After experiencing the new local adventure activities, the participants will be offered to continue their outdoor adventure activities at Owasippe.

We had our first meeting with a key staff person with the Chicago Park District that is responsible for their nature, outdoor education, and environmental activity planning. We have set program planning in motion to expand the adventure nature programming for their land based park resources and also the sailing and boating opportunities on Lake Michigan. We are being given a free user permit to use Northerly Island [ie. Meigs Field] for our kick-off activity. The tentative date for this is the first Saturday in June. Publicity will follow once the date is firm.
