



Requiem for An Elder of The Tribe - Frank S. Accardi

Frank S. Accardi, 95, passed away peacefully on December 3, 2022 surrounded by his loving family. Frank was thoughtful, caring, spiritual and made friends wherever he went and worked with others. He was serious about his relationship with God and prayer but he also had a sense of humor that never failed and always made his family and friends laugh.

One of the great works of Frank's life was his involvement with the Chicago Area Boy Scouts of America. Through his parish, Maternity B.V.M, he joined a Cub Scout Committee, which then led to his role as Scoutmaster for Troop 109 for over 15 years. He guided a very active troop which included annual visits to his beloved Owasippe Scout Reservation in Michigan, a trip to Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico and his induction into the Order of the Arrow and journey to the Vigil Honor. Both of Frank's sons were Eagle Scouts and his daughter was a Girl Scout and was included in many scouting events, including Philmont. Frank received the District Award of Merit and the Silver Beaver Award from the Chicago Area Council.

Later Frank and JoAnn ran a senior camp at Owasippe where old friends and new friends would come to the Scout camp and experience the Michigan woods and behave like youngsters again. It was at this time that he was asked to serve at Owasippe Scout Reservation as its Assistant Reservation director for two years. In 1963 at a Pathfinder District Camporee at Ft. Dearborn, Frank was tapped out by the Cahokia Chapter Ceremonial Team and began his journey in the Order of the Arrow. He sealed his membership in the Order the following year, again at Ft. Dearborn by accepting the responsibility of the Brotherhood Honor. Frank served first as an Associate Advisor of Cahokia Chapter and later as its Advisor. He was then summoned to serve as an Associate Lodge Advisor by a true legend of Owasippe Lodge — Sheridan U. Nunn. In 1968 Frank was called by his Brothers in the Arrow to the Vigil Honor for a life of cheerful service to Scouting.
