
- Cook Cabin 1 finishing touches



### **Summer Camp 2024**

Summer Camp at Owasippe Scout Reservation will be a busy place this summer. Blackhawk is expecting 172 troops over 7 weeks. Wolverine is expecting 118 troops over 6 weeks plus 1 week of Cub Scouts and Webelos Scouts. Reneker is expecting 150 families over 7 weeks.

This is an increase in campers over the previous year. And why shouldn't there be an increase? There are so many activities that the campers get to do. Scouts will have about 70 different merit badges to choose from while at camp this summer. This is in addition to all those great camp activities that we loved as a kid (and still do even though we are not quite so young).

Besides just getting away and spending some time in the woods. Campers will be swimming, canoeing, kayaking, paddleboarding, sailing, waterskiing, and fishing. They will be shooting arrow, BB's, 22's and shotguns. They will be hiking to Turtle Valley, The Bog, Owasippe's Grave, Paradise Valley and Deuce's Wild. They will be riding horses, mountain bikes and ATVs. They will be sliding down zip-lines, climbing towers and stacks of milk crates. They will be exploring the White River, Cleveland Creek, Lake Wolverine and Big Blue Lake. They will be learning to tie knots, cooking meals, building campfires, cooking fires, pioneering projects and survival shelters. They will be watching the stars, taking care of the environment, learning about plants, animals, rocks and the weather. They will be forging metal, making paper, dipping candles, weaving baskets, tie-dying t-shirts, stamping leather, and carving wood.

The summer camp leadership team of Nick Chavarria, Dalton DeVries, Sophia Finley, Jonah Klima, Kyle Peters, and Joe Vitti have been working hard to prepare for this summer with all their area directors to put forth an outstanding program for those attending. Summer camp is often considered the highlight of the year in Scouts and this summer should be no exception.

Period 2 created a new set of memories for both the campers and the staff as a storm on Tuesday morning took out power at the camp. Both Whitehall and Muskegon also had power losses as well. The power was not completely restored at camp until Friday afternoon. The essential powered items (water pumps, camp communication, refrigeration, Food Prep, etc) were kept running via generators. This certainly added a twist that no one was expecting on the morning of the BSA's national camp inspection.
