Jason Roepke



First off, let me start with some praise for a visionary. Vince Rychtanek deserves a great deal of credit for registering owasippe.net and building the original OSA website "way back" in the mid 90s. Vince handed the reins over to me in the late 90s, when I was working for a web development company on the North Shore of Chicago. Over the 30 years since then, the OSA managed to obtain the .com and .org web addresses, and the website itself had been through several iterations. The last version of the website went live back in 2014.

This past fall the OSA Board expressed interest in giving owasippe.com a complete overhaul. The website was ten years old, and was definitely due for some major updating. Web technology and best practices have come a long way in those ten years. And, like a house you've lived in for ten years, the site had accumulated an absolute TON of clutter. Some of it good, some of it trash, and some of it you don't even remember how it got there.

Anyway, long story short, the OSA website has been completely rebuilt. The new site does a much better job of supporting mobile functionality. A big chunk of the aforementioned clutter has been cleaned out. Numerous redundant pages have been cleaned up, re-organized, and in some cases, combined, to streamline the user experience. A Google Calendar has also been added to allow Board members and other key volunteers the ability to more-easily post and edit OSA events and deadlines.

A website is sort of a living, breathing thing. While the main work has been completed, it will never truly be "done." As time permits, additional improvements and tweaks will be made. Some photos will be added down the line as well.

One of the main goals of all of this work has been to hopefully present the OSA's mission more clearly, and tell our story more effectively to prospective members and donors. I believe that goal has been reached, and I appreciate the Board entrusting me to do the work.
